

Dear St. Francis Xavier Families,

Thank you for a wonderful first month of school. The students have adjusted well to their new teachers and classroom routines. Please let us know if there is anything we can do to make your child's experience even better than it has been! Thank you also for sending your child in full uniform and with all the supplies he or she needs to be successful in the classroom.

This past week our students have not had access to Xavier Hall for either lunch or PE. The floors were being re-lined for volleyball and basketball, a task that was planned to be completed during the summer; however, it took us much longer to find a company that would do the work and to schedule a week to actually complete the job. Unfortunately, when the workers arrived at SFX, they realized that they had the wrong color paint! The black basketball lines have been painted, but the gold volleyball lines have not been. The workers have used red tape for those lines until they can return in a few weeks with the correct gold color.

As with this past week, we will have all students eat in their classrooms again on Tuesday, **September 6**. In honor of Labor Day, West Construction Company is hosting a luncheon in Xavier Hall on Tuesday for about two hundred laborers working on our school building. Thank you so very much for your cooperation and understanding!



I hope that you have enjoyed seeing the daily progress on the new school building. It's so exciting to see the changes from day-to-day and week-to-week! The brick work and stucco are almost complete. Once that happens, we'll see very few changes as all the work will be inside the building. I will do my best to keep you informed of what is happening and provide pictures whenever possible. The completion date is still set for early March, with our taking occupancy by mid-March. Please pray with me that we don't run into unexpected delays!

We are coming to the close of our Fall MAP testing. Assessment results will be sent home soon. Students are also completing the Fall Religion Benchmark Assessments. Those results take longer to come to us from the Diocese. We'll get those results to you as soon as we receive them.

Families who have not yet signed and returned the annually required permission and acknowledgement forms sent through FACTS should do so by Wednesday, **September 7**, 2022.

In preparation for our move into our new school, which was designed with safety and security in mind, we will begin using an electronic check-in and check-out system called SchoolPass. Families will use this program when they drop-off students arriving late or when they take students out of school early for doctors' appointments. This program will also be used to check in visitors to our school and automatically print a badge for the visitor to wear while on campus. A separate email will be sent with instructions on how to use the new system located in the front office. Thank you for your cooperation.

Did you know?

Did you know that there are individuals in the Catholic Church who have been given the title of Doctor of the Church? The title Doctor of the Church is given to saints recognized as having made a significant contribution to theology or doctrine through their research, study, or writing.

The first church doctors were declared by Pope Boniface VIII in the 13th century: Sts. Ambrose, Jerome, Augustine, and Pope Gregory the Great. The first women to be named as church doctors were Sts. Teresa of Avila and Catherine of Siena in 1970, by Pope Paul VI.

Even today, holy men and women are being recognized and declared as Doctors of the Church with the most recents being St. John of Avila and St. Hildegard of Bingen in 2012, and St. Gregory of Narek in 2015. There are 37 declared Doctors of the Church!

During the month of September we will celebrate the feast days of the following Doctors of the Church:

St. Gregory the Great – September 3, St. John Chrysostom – September 13, St. Jerome – September 30.
